Series Overview

Our identity, our authority is anchored in a dimension of reality called heaven. It is the domain of God's dominion — perfect harmony, true identity, full authority. Every blessing is ours in the heavenly realm (Ephesians 1:3). Heaven is invading earth right here, right now. How? With a supernatural demonstration of God's love and power and wisdom. As citizens of heaven, we represent the heavenly realm. The goal? On earth, as it is in heaven.

Message Overview

The disintegration of civilization is caused by the deterioration of what British historian Arnold Toynbee called the **CREATIVE MINORITY**. The church is the creative minority, as well as a moral minority. It must swim upstream and go against the grain. Then—and only then—can it catalyze revivals, reformations, and renaissances. The key to this creative minority? Unity in diversity. That is what results in spiritual maturity. That is what nets this **BELOVED COMMUNITY** we call the church. In the words of NCCer David Grizzle, "Unity among DISSIMILAR people serves the purpose of being INDISPUTABLE **PROOF that God is in the house!"** Let's not settle for the façade of **UNIFORMITY**. Let's strive for biblical unity!

Message-Specific Discussion Questions

Pastor Mark said, one of the ways that God is actively at work right now is through "activating the gifts of the Spirit in unprecedented ways." In what ways are you seeing this in your life or in your community?

A few years after Jesus' death and resurrection, Caesar Augustus declared himself "Pontifex Maximus" or the Chief Priest of Rome. Upon his death, Augustus was declared the Son of God. So simply put, Caesar is Lord. Anything less and anything else was treason against Rome. When Paul says "there is ONE LORD" (Ephesians 4:4-6), referring to Jesus, it is a creedal coup d'état against Rome. How have you declared Jesus Christ your Lord? How has culture elevated modern-day caesars as Lord?

In your own life, how are you stewarding privilege in a way that incarnates the gospel?
