Series Overview

Unshaken is living countercultural, even if it costs you a fiery furnace. Unshaken is letting your conscience be your guide, even if it lands you in a lion's den. God is not nervous. God is victorious. Simply put, God's got this! When the world feels shaken, we can rest upon the Unshaken One. When all else fails, He never will. Join us in this 12-week reading plan as we dive deeper into the book of Daniel and how it applies to our lives today.

Series Discussion Questions

How are you living out what you're learning from the book of Daniel in your life right now?

Message Overview

One of the greatest gifts God can give us is letting us get to the end of our rope! That's often when and where and how we discover that there is a God. And just as important, I am not Him! Playing God is impossible! The good news? God is still on His throne! Don't lose faith in the end of the story! Virtue signaling won't get us where we need to go as a nation. Neither will hashtags. What we need is revival sparked by repentance. God opposes the proud, but He gives grace to the humble! The Spirit of God can't fill you if you're full of yourself, but if you'll empty yourself of pride, God will fill the void with His love, His power, His grace.

Message-Specific Discussion Questions

Describe your relationship with the Word of God. How have you had a hunger for His Word?

What does it look like to know the language of man? What does it look like to know the language of God? How does knowing both play out in the life of a prophet?

Pastor Mark says pruning is necessary "for structural integrity," for "optimal fruitfulness," and "for growth." How and where is God pruning you?

"The only ceiling on your intimacy with God and your impact on the world is time spent in daily spiritual disciplines." Spiritual disciplines include but are not limited to worship, prayer, meditation/contemplation, fasting, study, simplicity, solitude, submission, confession, celebration, and service. What spiritual disciplines have been filling you up in this season? Which ones are your go-to practices? Are there new ones you feel led to try?

Where have you seen virtual signaling – publicly expressing an opinion that is socially acceptable and politically correct, but is disingenuous – within the Church and culture today?

God uses ordinary people with prophetic anointing, enabling them to do things they cannot take credit for. Share an experience of being Spirit-led and carrying that anointing.

How do you protect yourself from falling into that place of pride and "playing God"?
