Message Overview

Message-Specific Discussion Questions

Take some time to think about what matters to you. What do you believe about these things?

We are in a very interesting season with: racial injustice, pandemic, and political unrest. **How are your beliefs impacting the actions that you are taking?**

Dr. Foth brought out in Hebrews 13:8 the importance of Jesus being the same yesterday, today, and forever. **How are you placing Jesus as the most important/superior aspect of your life? How are you anchoring yourself in his eternal consistency?**

Read through Exodus 3:14. **What do you believe God is speaking regarding His identity? How are you allowing "I AM" to overtake the issues of yesterday?**
